

(understanding the "seamless" thread of the Bible)



#### **Old Sanctuary Elevator Being De-Commissioned**



In 1987, the Elevator in the back of the sanctuary was a very helpful addition to our church facilities. Many people were able to access the sanctuary much more easily and participate in worship services and other events, and some of them would not have been able to attend without the assistance of the elevator. It has served our congregation well for nearly 40 years, but unfortunately, now that is no longer the case. Due to electrical problems it has not been in service for several weeks, and we recently found out from the elevator repair company that it is beyond help. The parts necessary to fix it are no longer available, and if there was a major overhaul completed on this elevator to meet current regulations and standards, it would be extremely expensive. For these reasons, this elevator must be decommissioned by state of Ohio authorities and taken out of use.

While this is disappointing news, thankfully we have a much bigger, better and easily accessible newer elevator located at the handicapped accessible door in the rear of the Center for Hope. We also have increased the number of "blue" parking spaces near those doors for all who have issues with mobility. We are seeking to do all that we practically can to help make our church facilities as accessible as possible to all people.
