Sacrificial Meal Explained



For several decades in our church it has been a tradition to offer a "Sacrificial Meal" experience on Maundy Thursday before our Communion Service. However, we now realize that there are many in our congregation who do not know what the "Sacrificial Meal" is or why we have it. It is a quiet, solemn opportunity during Holy Week to focus on Jesus and His sacrificial love for all of us. This year we will meet in the sanctuary on Maundy Thursday, April 17, by 6:15pm. There will be about 10 minutes of reflective devotions, and then everyone will quietly proceed to the Fellowship Hall for a "sacrificial meal" together. The meager meal consists of a small bowl of rice soup, crackers, some cheese and fruit. It is not a meal intended to fill our stomachs, but a light meal and time of quiet devotion to nourish our souls. The silence of the occasion and sparse meal are to help us more thoroughly reflect on Jesus' suffering, sacrifice and the price He paid for the sins of the world. At about 6:55pm we will proceed back up to the sanctuary for the Maundy Thursday Communion Service, which begins at 7:00pm. There is no talking during any of this "sacrificial meal" time from 6:15-7:00pm. Our Nursery will be available for those children who are too young to participate and stay quiet for this solemn experience.

Anyone is welcome to participate, but for planning purposes it is helpful to have a general idea of how many to prepare for. Please consider participating in this unique spiritual experience, and please sign the "RSVP sheet" in the back of the sanctuary or Center for Hope by April 14th if you plan to attend. Thank you.


