## **Focus Scriptures**

Ezekiel 33:1-6 ~ "Once again a message came to me from the Lord: 2 "Son of man, give your people this message: 'When I bring an army against a country, the people of that land choose one of their own to be a watchman. When the watchman sees the enemy coming, he sounds the alarm to warn the people. <sup>4</sup> Then if those who hear the alarm refuse to take action, it is their own fault if they die. <sup>5</sup> They heard the alarm but ignored it, so the responsibility is theirs. If they had listened to the warning, they could have saved their lives. <sup>6</sup> But if the watchman sees the enemy coming and doesn't sound the alarm to warn the people, he is responsible for their captivity. They will die in their sins, but I will hold the watchman responsible for their deaths.' Now, son of man, I am making you a watchman for the people of Israel. Therefore, listen to what I say and warn them for me. 8 If I announce that some wicked people are sure to die and you fail to tell them to change their ways, then they will die in their sins, and I will hold you responsible for their deaths. <sup>9</sup> But if you warn them to repent and they don't repent, they will die in their sins, but you will have saved yourself. . . . <sup>11</sup> As surely as I live, says the Sovereign Lord, I take no pleasure in the death of wicked people. I only want them to turn from their wicked ways so they can live. Turn! Turn from your wickedness, O people of Israel! Why should you die?"

2 Corinthians 5:18,20,6:1-2 ~ "All this is from God, who reconciled us to Himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation... <sup>20</sup> We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making His appeal through us... 6 As God's co-workers we urge you not to receive God's grace in vain. <sup>2</sup> For He says, "In the time of my favor I heard you, and in the day of salvation I helped you." I tell you, now is the time of God's favor, now is the day of salvation."

## **Roof/AC/Heat ~ Help is Needed!**

As it has been shared for many months (and even years), the heating and air conditioning systems in the "older" church building are in very poor condition, are no longer practically functional and need to be replaced. This past spring it was discovered that the 20 year old flat roof liner over the educational wing had at least 40 holes in it. These holes were temporarily patched, but detailed inspection revealed that this roof also needs to be replaced.

A knowledgeable group representative of Church Council, Trustees and dedicated church members has been working tirelessly on the best solution to these pressing issues. Several reputable companies were sought for input, advice and estimates, and many different options have been considered for the best solution now and for the longtime benefit of our congregation. The Church Council has received and reviewed the task group's recommendation and voted unanimously to move forward with a plan of action.

It is obvious to everyone involved that action must be taken soon regarding the roof, heating and AC issues. And all agree that the most prudent course of action is to tackle all of these needs at the same time. It is also obvious that all of this necessary work comes with a high price tag, but thankfully it is not as high as originally thought!

All companies contacted made it very clear that the new highly efficient systems will bring significant savings to WMC regarding our utility bills, and if we wait to move forward with this, in January 2025 cost estimates will increase by 15-20%. Now is the time to move forward as properly maintaining our 1926/1952 facility is a high priority.


We realize this is another very "big ticket" item following the need to raise \$212,000 for disaffiliation fees in the spring of 2023. However, just as it was a necessity to do so 15 months ago to survive as a vital church in the center of Wintersville, it is essential to move forward with this roof/heating/AC project for our 1926/1952 church building to survive as a functional location for worship, Christian growth and discipleship, ministries and outreach in our community in Jesus' name.

A task group has been formed to address fundraising, and more specific information will be shared in the near future. But for now, please prayerfully consider how you might support this urgent need. Thank you for your faithfulness to the Lord and WMC in this way.
